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# About the Rating Scale

The QbCheck Rating Scale adds a subjective perspective to the evaluation process. The scale is developed from the 18 questions in DSM-5, describing patterns of behavior associated with ADHD. Each behavior is rated over the last 6 months and graded as Never/Rarely, Sometimes, Often and Very often.

Children 6-17 years, must present Often or Very Often on six items in at least one category to display a persistent pattern of ADHD-like symptoms according to the DSM-5 criteria. Test takers 18 years and older must present with five items rated Often or Very often in at least one category, in order to display a persistent pattern ADHD-like symptoms according to the DSM-5 criteria.

### Rating Scale Results

This test taker has 6 items in the Inattentive category and 9 items in the Hyperactive/ Impulsive category that are rated as Often or Very Often. The test taker thus meets the criteria for displaying ADHD-like symptoms according to DSM-5.
